Rights of Privately Sponsored Refugees

The RSTP has created an information sheet for privately sponsored newcomers, called **The Rights of Privately Sponsored Refugees**.

This resource explains rights, what should be expected from sponsors, and what to do if privately sponsored newcomers have concerns about the sponsorship. The content includes:

- What should you receive from your sponsors?
- What are your settlement responsibilities?
- What are sponsors not allowed to do?
- What should you do if you are not receiving enough support from your sponsors?
- What should you do if you are being mistreated, exploited or abused?
- What will happen to you if you report your concerns to IRCC?
- What are your rights?
