# Women and the Definition of Refugee

#### Refugee Women as a Particular Social Group

Although the original refugee definition, didn't explicitly refer to 'gender' or gender based violence as a ground of persecution, through interpretation it is widely accepted and recognized that violence against women is one of the major forms of persecution experienced by women in the context of refugee status and asylum. This doesn't mean that all women are automatically entitled to refugee status. The woman in refugee situation must establish that she has a well-founded fear of being persecuted due to her membership in a particular social group, in this case her gender.

### What is Gender-related persecution?

- Acts of sexual violence such as rape and other forms of sexual assault;
- Family or domestic violence including forced/early marriage, dowry-related violence, coerced family planning or forced sterilization;
- Female genital mutilation;
- Trafficking;
- Discrimination against the LGBTQ community; and
- Political or religious persecution for holding feminist or other views, and failing to conform to gender-prescribed social norms

These include any acts that inflict severe pain and suffering, both mental and physical, and have been used as forms of persecution, whether by State or private actors.

### Women and Resettlement to Canada

Refugee women can be qualified as refugees and come through other private sponsorship streams. Canada's Women at Risk Program allows for the resettlement of women who face persecution in the country of asylum. In many cases, women eligible under this program will come through the Joint Assistant Sponsorship (JAS) program.

### Private Sponsors; What to Consider

#### **Pre-Arrival Preparation**

- Make sure a woman is part of the sponsoring group
- Have a female interpreter when the refugee doesn't speak English
- Consult with the refugee woman about the pre-arrival decisions and possible post arrival needs (especially regarding trauma and violence)
- Prepare the refugee woman for her interview and discuss available options and accommodations

#### **Arrival**

- Have female members at the airport, so the newcomer feels safe
- Consult with female family members regarding documentation and information collected at the airport

#### **Post Arrival**

- Include the resettled refugee woman in making decisions about temporary and permanent, accommodation, healthcare providers, schools, childcare and other settlement-related tasks
- Be mindful of the psychological needs the newcomer may have
- Provide orientation on the rights of women and resources for victims of torture, domestic violence and other forms of trauma



PA is a 38 year old Sudanese married woman with three children. She has 8 years of formal education. PA and her family cannot return to their home country as they fear for their safety and persecution based on ongoing ethnic conflicts. PA has a friend in Edmonton, AB and it is recommended that they resettle there.

Family size: Sudanese husband, wife and two children.


**Language:** The husband is educated and has been successful in his language classes.
