We have not accepted any funds from the refugees we are sponsoring and will not require the refugee to repay any cost of sponsorship. We understand that any sponsor who attempts to secure or does accept such funds will be considered by IRCC to be in default of this sponsorship undertaking.

ROC-O will be accepting the previous version of the Undertaking (IMM 5373 08/15), until **December 31, 2017.**

Available JAS Profiles In-Canada JAS

PROFILE #: 0153-04-17- London, ON Yazidi Survivor of Daesh

Family Composition: The PA is a 32 year old Iraqi single mother with 8 young children, ages ranging from 1 to 12 years of age.

<u>Support Needed:</u> The family would benefit from <u>emotional support</u> for both the PA and her children as the PA is, at times, unable to properly look after her children due to her own emotional state. The children have all shown some signs of behavioural problems making it increasingly more difficult for the



PA to manage on her own. Extra emotional, physical and social supports would enable the family to feel more secure and safe, allowing them to better heal and thrive during their resettlement in Canada.

PROFILE #: 0154-04-17 - London, ON Yazidi Survivor of Daesh

Family Composition: A 32 years old Iraqi single mother with 3 young children, the oldest being 12 years old and the youngest being 3 years old.

Support Needed: The mother could use support in caring for her children as they are extremely hyperactive and require supervision. The sponsor's support will help the family physically, emotionally, and socially.

In addition to these cases we have 10 more Yazidi Survivor of Daesh cases in London, ON.

PROFILE #: 0384-05-17 Victoria, BC

Family Composition: Syrian family of 6 including 4 young children between 2 and 7 years old. The family experienced violence due to past events that happened in their home country, which have caused serious injuries to some of the family members. The spouse and the 7 years old son were victims of violence and trauma in the country of refuge.

<u>Support Needed:</u> Due to the experiences of violence faced, counselling is required. The family will gain much needed support while they work through their health challenges and significant traumas. This sponsorship would also provide the time necessary to continue redeveloping how to be a mother while practicing self-cafe and providing the attention necessary to the high-needs children. This family is struggling with transition into Canada and additional time to be supported and go through stages of settlement, would be vital.

In-Canada JAS PROFILE #: 0595-08-17 Toronto, ON

Family Composition: The PA is a 41 year old Syrian male accompanied by his spouse and 6 children (ages 4 to 17). Three of their children have developmental disabilities and are awaiting more specific diagnosis based on assessment. Two of their children with disabilities have not started school yet and require total care.

<u>Support Needed:</u> The family would benefit from support in managing their mail and scheduling appointments, helping with applying to various private funding organizations for children with disabilities and finding childcare. Also, they would benefit from a sponsor who could provide assistance in navigating respite, financial and emotional, challenges in living in a new country. In addition, assistance with education, attending medical appointments and life skills coaching will enhance the family's ability to settle in Canada.

In addition to these cases we have eight more in-Canada JAS cases available!
