You Asked

Are there any updates on how sponsored refugees travelling to Canada are expected to comply with the negative COVID-19 testing requirements that came into effect on January 07, 2021?

Answer

As of January 07, 2021, all persons travelling to Canada by air that are over the age of 5, including sponsored refugees, are required to test negative for COVID-19 before travelling to Canada.

Documentation of a negative laboratory test result must be presented to the airline prior to boarding a flight to Canada.

The test must be performed using a COVID-19 molecular polymerase chain reaction (PCR) or Loop mediated isothermal amplification (LAMP) test and must be taken within 72 hours prior to the traveller's scheduled departure to Canada.

The onus is on the traveller to get a test and provide proof of their test result.

For sponsored refugees, IRCC has a protocol in place with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) to provide certain COVID-19 related predeparture health measures, including testing.

In locations where the IOM is assisting with the travel arrangements for refugees and has sufficient medical lab capacity, the IOM will also assist with the logistics for refugees to get tested for COVID-19 predeparture with no cost to the refugees.

After arrival, all persons entering Canada must still

complete the <u>mandatory 14-day quarantine</u>.

You Asked

Can travellers move to different accommodation during the mandatory 14-day quarantine period?

Answer

No, the place of quarantine <u>should not</u> be changed in any circumstances other than an emergency (e.g. the place of quarantine gets flooded, there is a fire or something else that forces a change).

The reason for this is because the goal of the quarantine period is to minimize how much contact the traveller has with non-travellers.

If the place of quarantine needs to be changed in the event of an emergency, the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) must be informed via email at:

phac.quarantine.covid19.quarantaine.aspc@canad a.ca

PHAC must always approve changes of address during the quarantine period.

However, PHAC understands that in some emergencies it may not be possible to inform them of the address change and wait for approval.

In these situations, PHAC should be informed as soon as possible after the incident.
