You Asked

How can sponsored newcomers correct errors or mistakes on their permanent resident card?

Answer

If the information on a newcomer's permanent resident (PR) card is incorrect, the card must be reissued, or they must apply for a new one.

You Asked

When will IRCC reissue a PR card?

Answer

If the mistake or error was made by IRCC, the newcomer can request to have the card reissued by:

- Applying to correct the mistake on the Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR) and/or the Record of Landing (if the mistake is also on these documents). <u>Click</u> <u>here</u> for information on how to request an amendment to the COPR or the Record of Landing.
- 2) Once the COPR and/or the Record of Landing have been corrected, the newcomer can apply to have the card reissued. Click here for instructions on how to do so and the application package.

You Asked

What if the mistake or error on the PR card

was not made by IRCC?

Answer

If the mistake on the PR card was not made by IRCC, the newcomer will need to apply for a new card and pay the \$50 processing fee.
