Does ROC-O accept

documents from EU

countries that grant subsidiary protection under EU law as proof of refugee status for Groups of Five and Community Sponsor applications? Subsidiary protection is

granted to individuals who do not meet the definition of a refugee but would be at risk of serious harm (namely, the death penalty; torture or inhuman or degrading treatment; or violence in situations of international or noninternational armed conflict) on return to their country of origin (see: Article 2 and Article 15 of EU Directive 2004/83/EC) (recognizing that individuals that have been granted subsidiary protection will most likely be considered as being locally integrated by Articles 26-29 of the Directive and not eligible for sponsorship to Canada).

refugee resettlement and integration. Since the Private Sponsorship of Refugees (PSR) Program was launched over four decades ago, Canadians

and permanent residents have come together to offer protection and a safe, permanent home for tens of thousands of refugees each year. Key to the program's success is over 130 organizations, known as sponsorship agreement holders (SAHs), who sponsor refugees year after year. As the program continues to grow, so has the number of these community organizations that want to support refugees. In recognition of this

growth, the Honourable Sean Fraser, Minister of

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced that the number of refugees SAHs could sponsor would increase to 13,500 in 2023. This represents a 10-fold increase from when the cap was introduced in 2012 or the addition of 12,150 spaces available to SAHs. The additional cap spaces will allow new SAHs to get their operations off the ground while helping professional organizations continue to grow. These organizations manage all aspects of the

sponsorship process, from identifying refugees and submitting applications to providing critical support to sponsored newcomers. **CLICK HERE FOR MORE**



Effective March 1, 2023, specific measures will make it easier for Iranians who wish to extend their temporary status in Canada and to move between temporary streams, allowing Iranians to continue studying, working or visiting family by applying for a new permit from inside Canada.


