FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. When do sponsors need to provide maternity food, clothing, and newborn allowances during the sponsorship period?

A. Under the Resettlement Assistance Program (RAP), specific allowances must be provided to newcomers that are pregnant or give birth during the sponsorship period.

The \$75 monthly maternity food allowance must be provided once the newcomer's pregnancy is confirmed until the end of the due date month or the end of the sponsorship period (whichever comes first).

The maternity food allowance is intended to cover food, vitamins and supplements for the pregnant newcomer. The maternity food allowance can be provided in addition to the standard dietary allowance of \$75 a month if the newcomer is eligible for both (i.e., they require a special diet due to a health condition).

The one-time \$200 maternity <u>clothing allowance</u> must be provided once the pregnancy is confirmed to assist with purchasing maternity clothing.

The one-time \$750 newborn allowance must be provided two months before the due date of the infant child. The newborn allowance must also be provided to newcomers with due dates up to two months after the sponsorship period ends.

The newborn allowance is issued per child; e.g., if the newcomer has twins, it would be given twice (a total of \$1500).

A husband (26), wife (22), and daughter (3) have a recommended destination of Ottawa, ON. The PA and their wife have some elementary schooling and speak Syrian Arabic; the daughter has not started school yet. The PA has some work experience as a chef.


