Canada under the Private Sponsorship of Refugees (PSR) program, the Blended Visa Office Referred (BVOR) program, the Joint Assistance Sponsorship (JAS) program and the Government Assisted Refugee (GAR) program may receive a Transportation Loan that is intended to assist them with covering the cost of their travel to Canada.

- board their flight to Canada (the cost of overnight accommodation and meals before departure are also covered); The cost of travel to Canada by the most direct route at the most economical rate
- available; The cost of any taxes or tolls;
- The cost of any operational escorts provided by the IOM; and,
- In-land transportation costs which may include the cost of overnight
